



Getting Started Writing Grants

- Identify 6-12 funders that are aligned to your goals. Then, identify 6-12 more funders that are nearly aligned to your goals.
 - Sign up for their alerts and subscribe to their newsletters.
- Create a strong executive summary.
 - Crafting a compelling, persuasive Executive Summary is the most important element in a grant application, as it will determine if you get placed in the "Move Forward", "Maybe" or "Doesn't Fit" pile.
 - Be sure to highlight something new where funders can see the direct impact of their funds. It may seem intuitive, but be sure to build your summary around what is being asked of the applicant.

Professional Grant Writer Tip:

Funders typically will not be happy if their funds will just be funding existing programs or operations. Nonprofits who are most successful usually will put funds to a new program or new way to serve their intended population.

Basic Executive Summary Elements


- Who are you?
- Why do you exist? What is the problem you solve? Use SMART descriptors. (Specific. Measurable. Achievable. Relevant. Time-bound.)
- · What do you do?
- What dollar amount are you requesting for a specific project or program?
- · What makes your project or program different from others? Be sure to ask yourself, "So what?" when answering this question.
- · What is your key differentiator? Why is your program uniquely positioned to solve the problem?

A few helpful reminders, too

- Don't be vague.
- · Don't use unnecessary facts.
- · Avoid jargon and acronyms.
- · Be clear. Clear is kind.

Be sure to use your time wisely.

Review the application parameters. Is the application 20 pages for \$1,000 or one page for a \$10,000 grant? Be sure that the time given to the grant is consistent with what you will receive from the funder.

- Customize your executive summary so that your proposal and the funder's mission and grantmaking interests are clearly and strategically linked.
 - Be sure to pay attention to if there's a word or character count.
- Answer all questions listed in the specific order given. Don't copy and paste previous answers. Be sure to customize. Do not include additional materials that are not requested. We know it's tempting!
- Whenever possible, copy and paste the questions into a Word document to draft your responses before submitting online applications. You can more easily count words/characters, pass along to colleagues for review/comment and maintain for future reference or use.
- Be sure you know the reporting requirements, if any, for your funder. Set calendar reminders for yourself with specific milestones so the reporting process isn't so daunting.
